
MEET ERIC CHING







County Supervisor to the Fifth Supervisorial District, which comprises more than 2,000 square miles, part of the San Gabriel, Pomona, San Fernando, Santa Clarita and Antelope Valleys. While in office, he championed for public safety, foster programs and parkland preservation.





Sheriff Alex Villanueva

Sheriff Alex Villanueva is the 33rd Sheriff of Los Angeles County

He is the first Spanish-speaking sheriff in the county. In 2018, retired sheriff's lieutenant Villanueva defeated incumbent Sheriff Jim McDonnell, becoming the first to unseat the incumbent in over 100 years. Sheriff Villanueva became the first Democratic Sheriff in LA County in almost 140 years.
